

Role of the Month – AH COUNTER

Taking on this role improves observational and listening skills

The purpose of the Ah-Counter is to note any overused words or filler sounds used as a crutch by anyone who speaks during the meeting. Words may be inappropriate interjections, such as *and, well, but, so* and *you know*. Sounds may be *ah, um* or *err*. As Ah-Counter you:

- When introduced during the club meeting, you will explain the role of the Ah-Counter.
- In the Ah-Counter's log, record overlong pauses, overused words and filler sounds relied upon too often by all speakers, such as *and, but, so, you know, ah,* and *um.*
- During the meeting's evaluation portion, you will report your observations when called upon.

Table Topics Tip

If you can, just stop panicking about Table Topics. Remember, everyone in the audience has been in your position, has probably dried up at some point and is wanting you to do well, so you don't need to worry about their reaction. Agenda Rules Reminder

- 1. Are you getting close to finishing your Competent Leader Manual, Competent Communicator Manual, or a *Pathways Level?* Once you have only one project or functionary role remaining to complete your manual or level, contact <u>Jenn Klocke</u>, CC, *before* an agenda opens to find out if you can have priority for the needed role on that agenda.
- 2. *Does your next project include a speech that is longer than 10 minutes?* Let <u>Jenn Klocke</u>, CC, know before you sign up, so she can remove one of the speaker slots to keep our meeting timely.
- 3. *Ever wonder if there's a preferred speaking order?* There is. The preferred order is to have members with less experience (e.g., ice breaker) speak before members with more experience, based on the number of speeches they have given in Toastmasters. Please keep this desired order in mind when you sign up. The Toastmaster-of-the-Day or an officer may rearrange the agenda's speaking order if speakers sign up out of order.
